\$388,900 pledge to building fund to date puts us within \$21,000 of goal

With 97 pledges to the "Upon the Rock" building fund campaign, the parish has raised \$388,900, putting us within \$21,000 of our goal of \$410,000. Thirty nine (39) pledge remain outstanding.

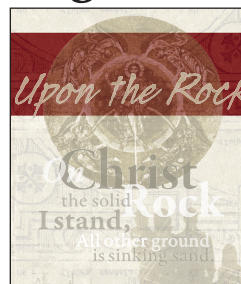

The theme for this campaign is drawn from Jesus' parable of the two builders, also known as the parable of the wise and foolish builders, found in Matthew 7:24-25, and Luke 6:47-49:

"Anyone who hears and obeys these teachings of mine is like a wise person who built a house on solid rock. Rain poured down, rivers flooded, and winds beat against that house. But it did not fall, because it was built on solid rock." (Matthew 7:24-25)

Your rector, **Fr. Ron Baird**, and Vestry are committed to being wise builders and responsible stewards of the trust God has placed in us as we establish a firm foundation for the future. Accordingly, this campaign calls for us to raise funds to pay off the \$350,000 second mortgage held by Polaris Assembly of God, from whom we

The mortgage with Polaris Assembly is on a five-year balloon note, with interest-only payments for the first two years.

As we come to the end of that two-year period, it is time to turn our attention to paying off that debt. Doing so will fulfill our commitment to Polaris Assembly, whose generosity enabled us to secure bank financing for the purchase of this property. It will also put us in a stronger equity position as we move forward with our long-term plans for expanding our facility and further developing our property.

Also included in the campaign are funds to hire an architect to design plans for future construction of a new worship facility.
